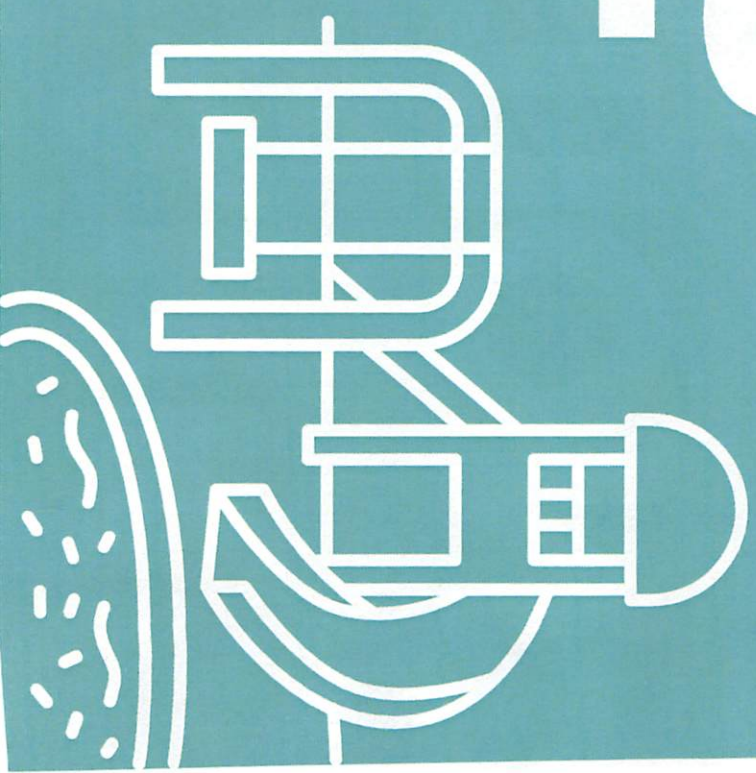

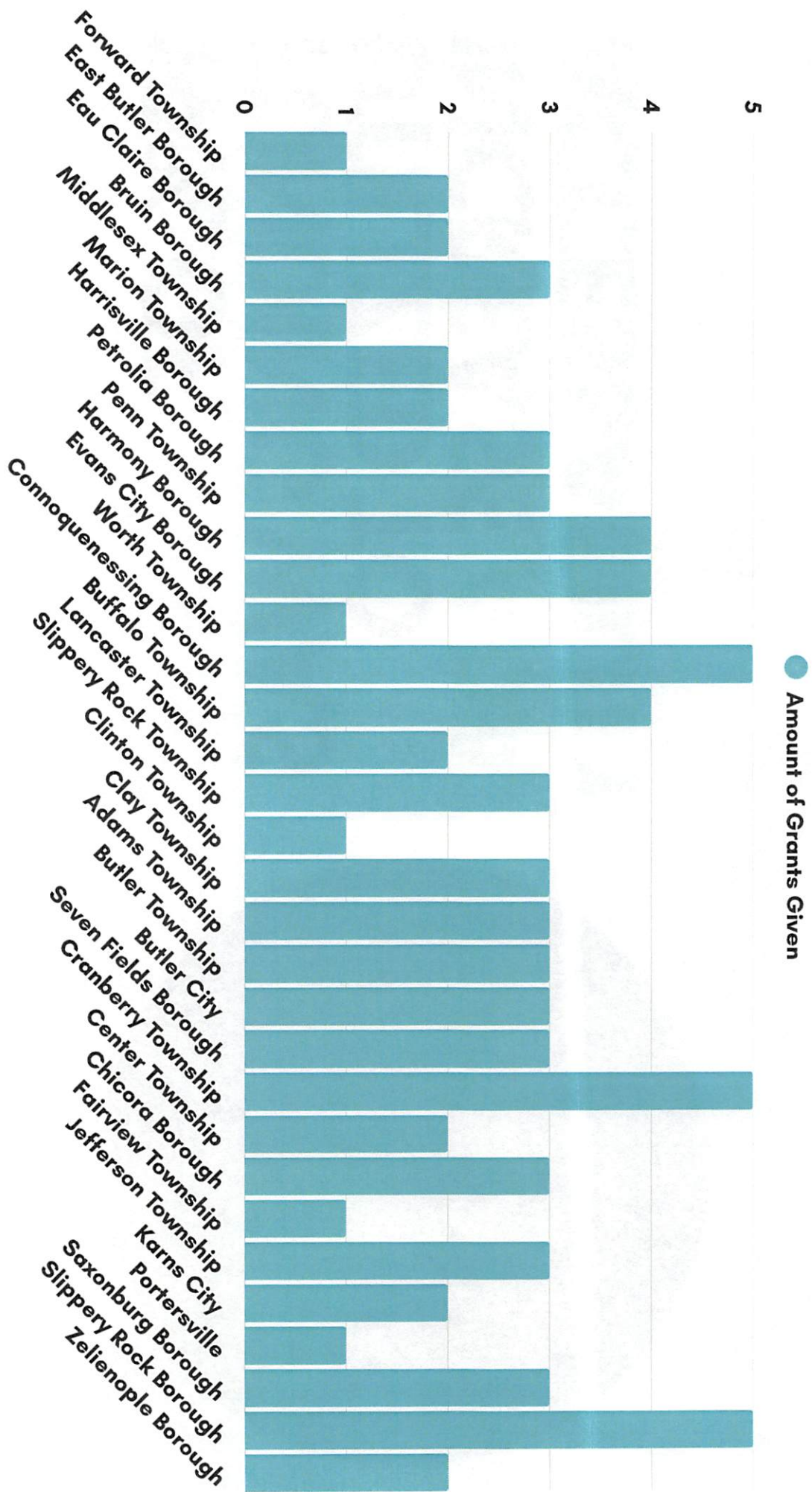

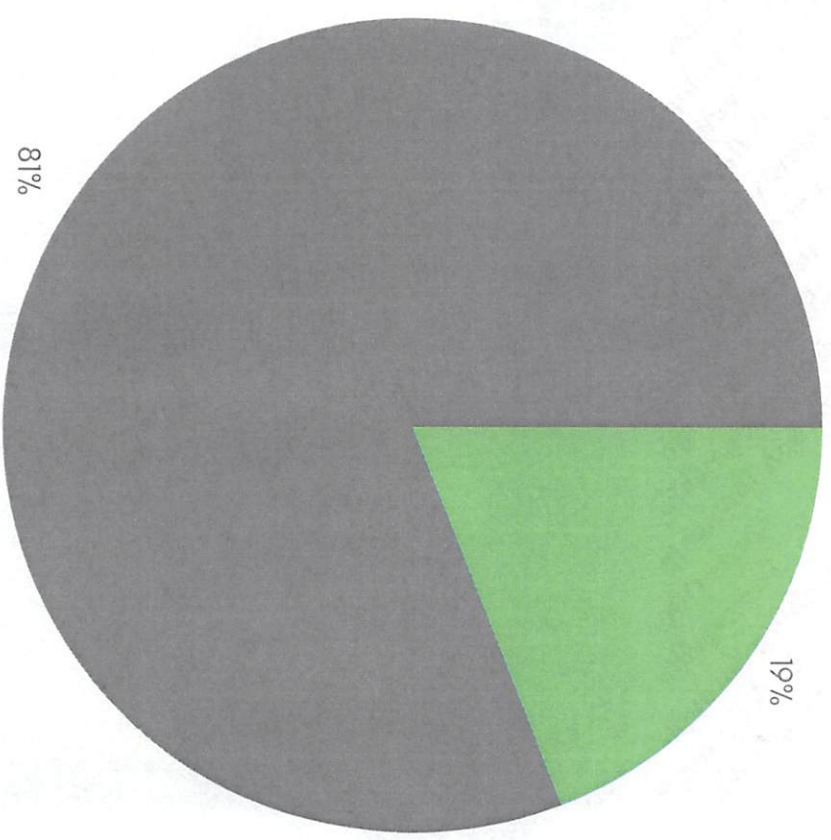
COMMUNITIES

19% OF FUNDING WAS UTILIZED TO INCREASE ADA ACCESSABILITY

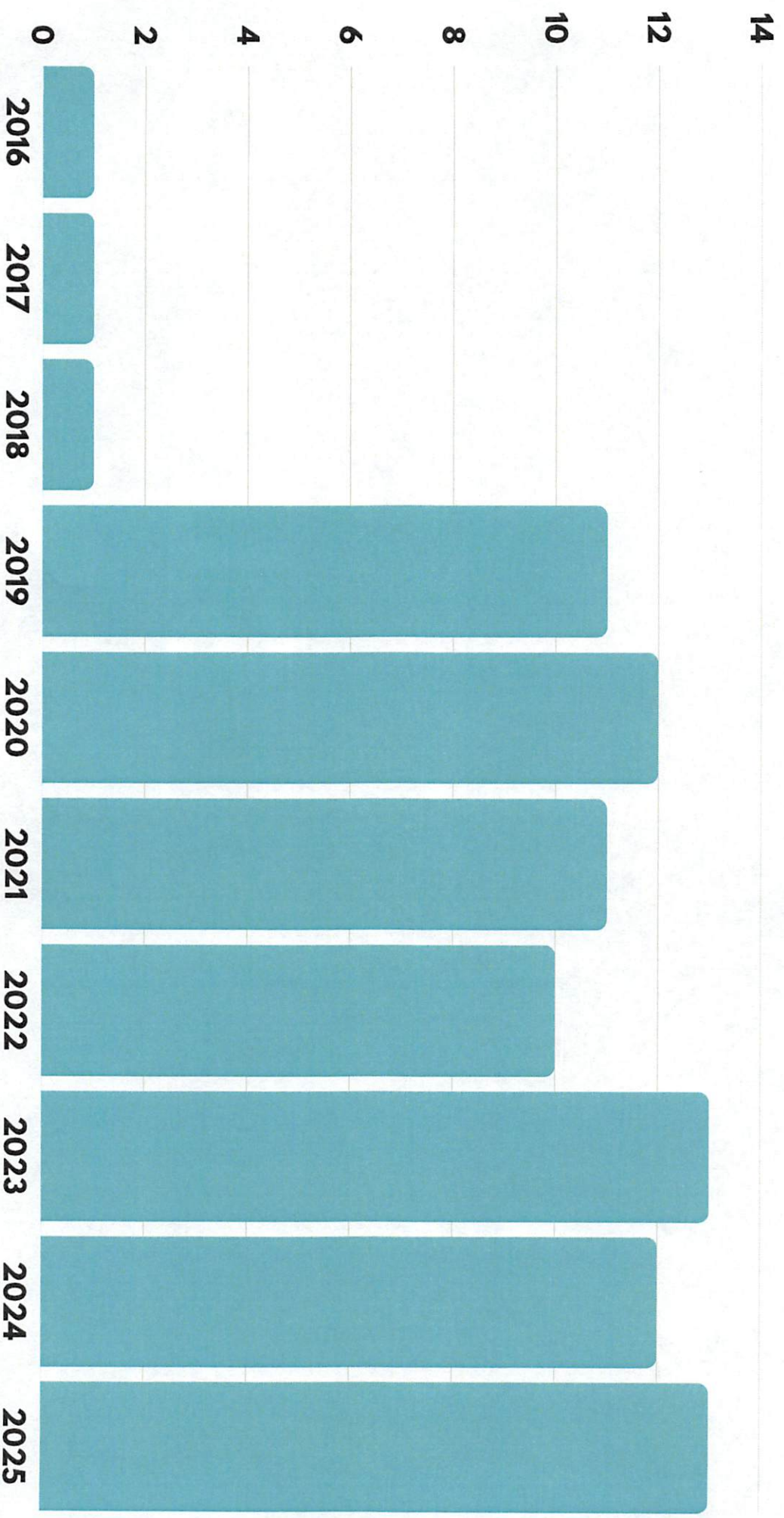


GRANTS

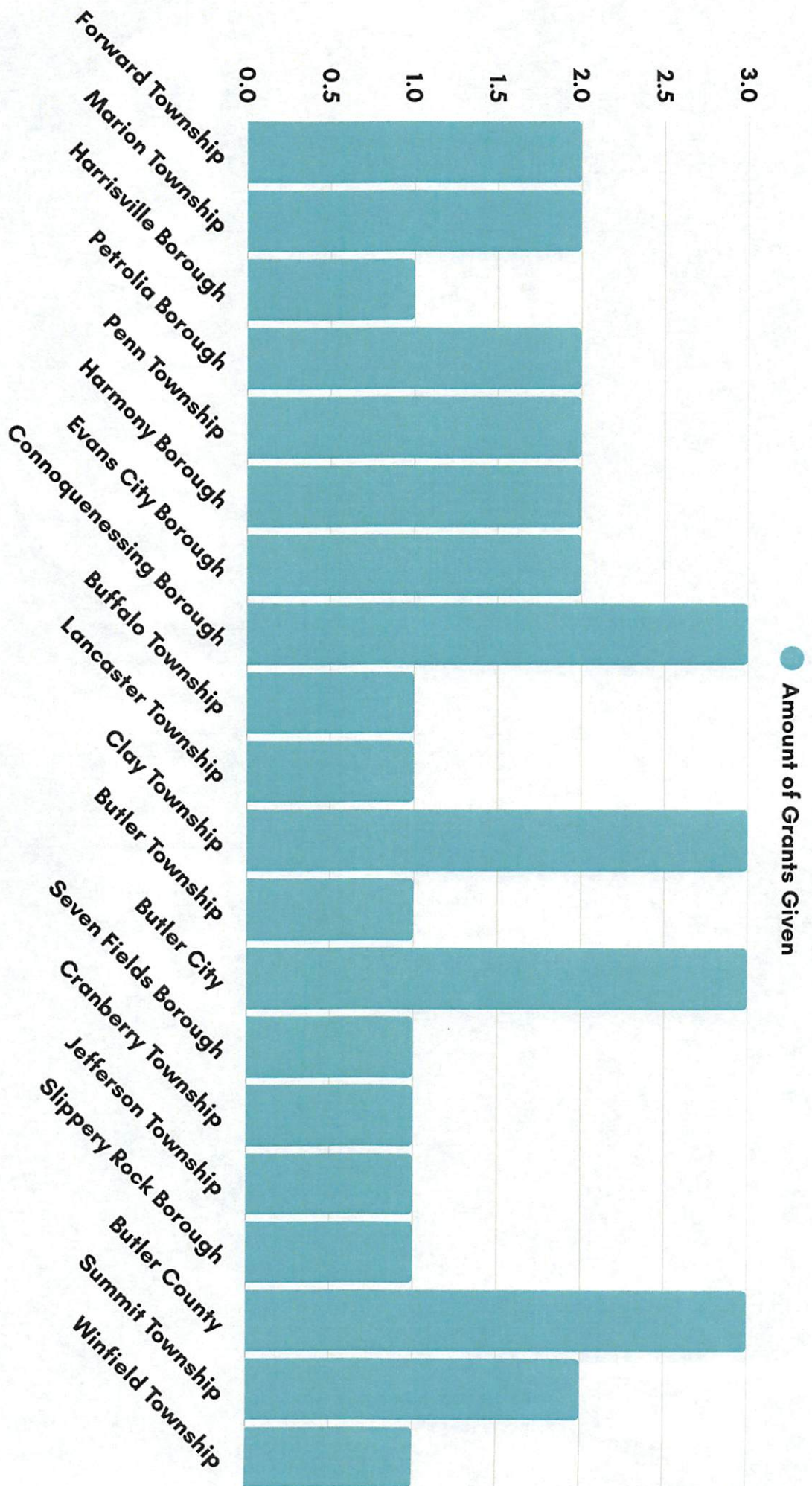

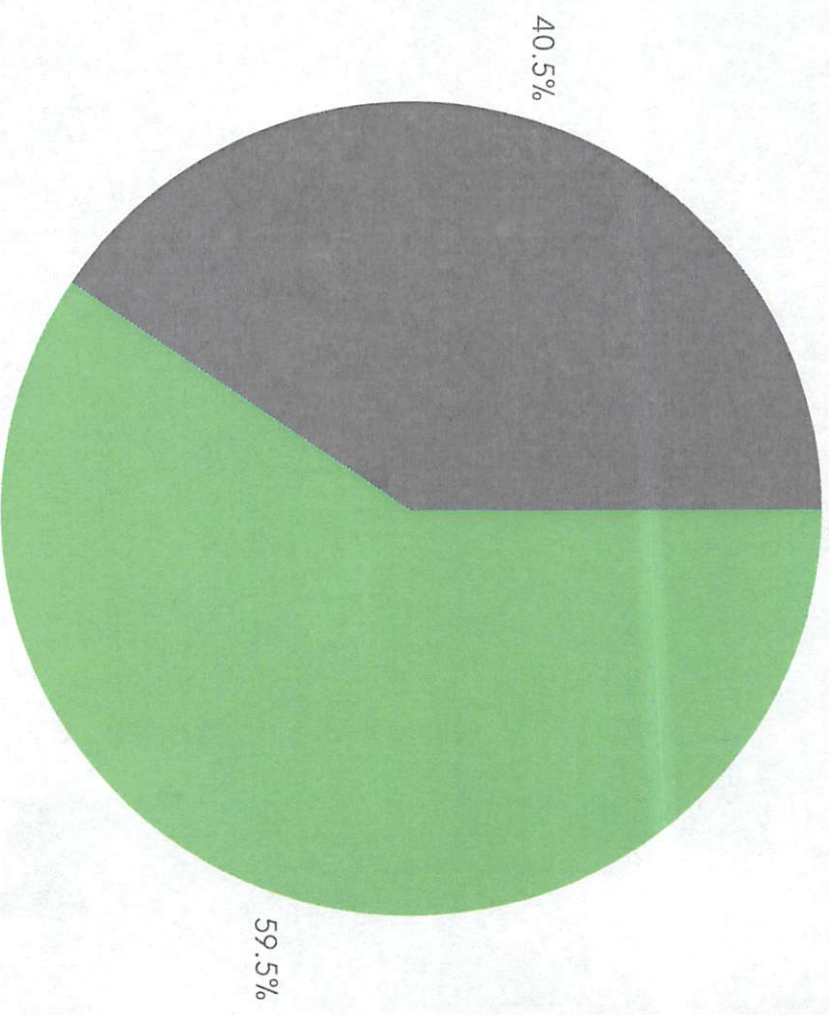
COMMUNITIES

- THE MOST GRANTS GIVEN TO A COMMUNITY WAS 5 TO CONNOQUENESSING BOROUGH



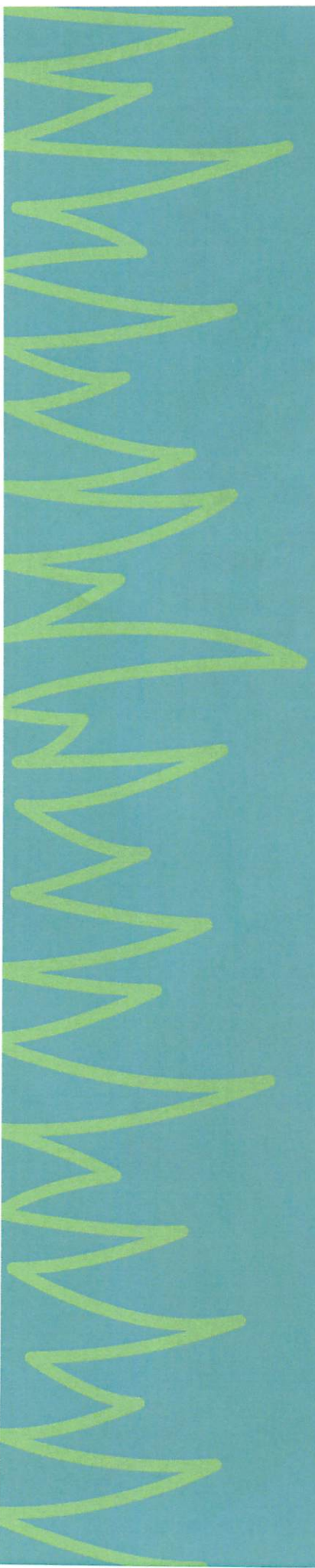


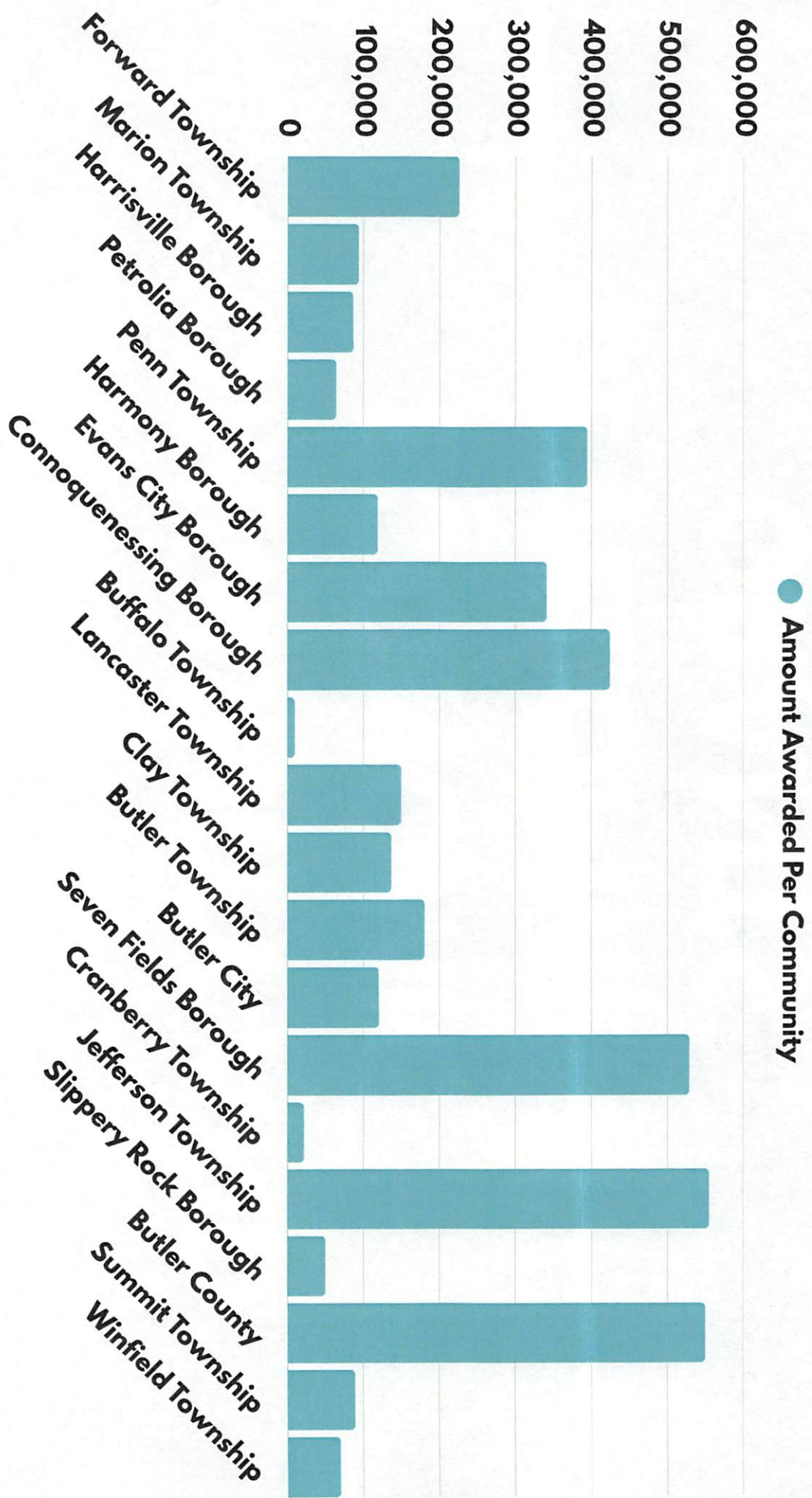
59.5% OF THE GRANTS WERE AWARDED TO SMALL COMMUNITIES

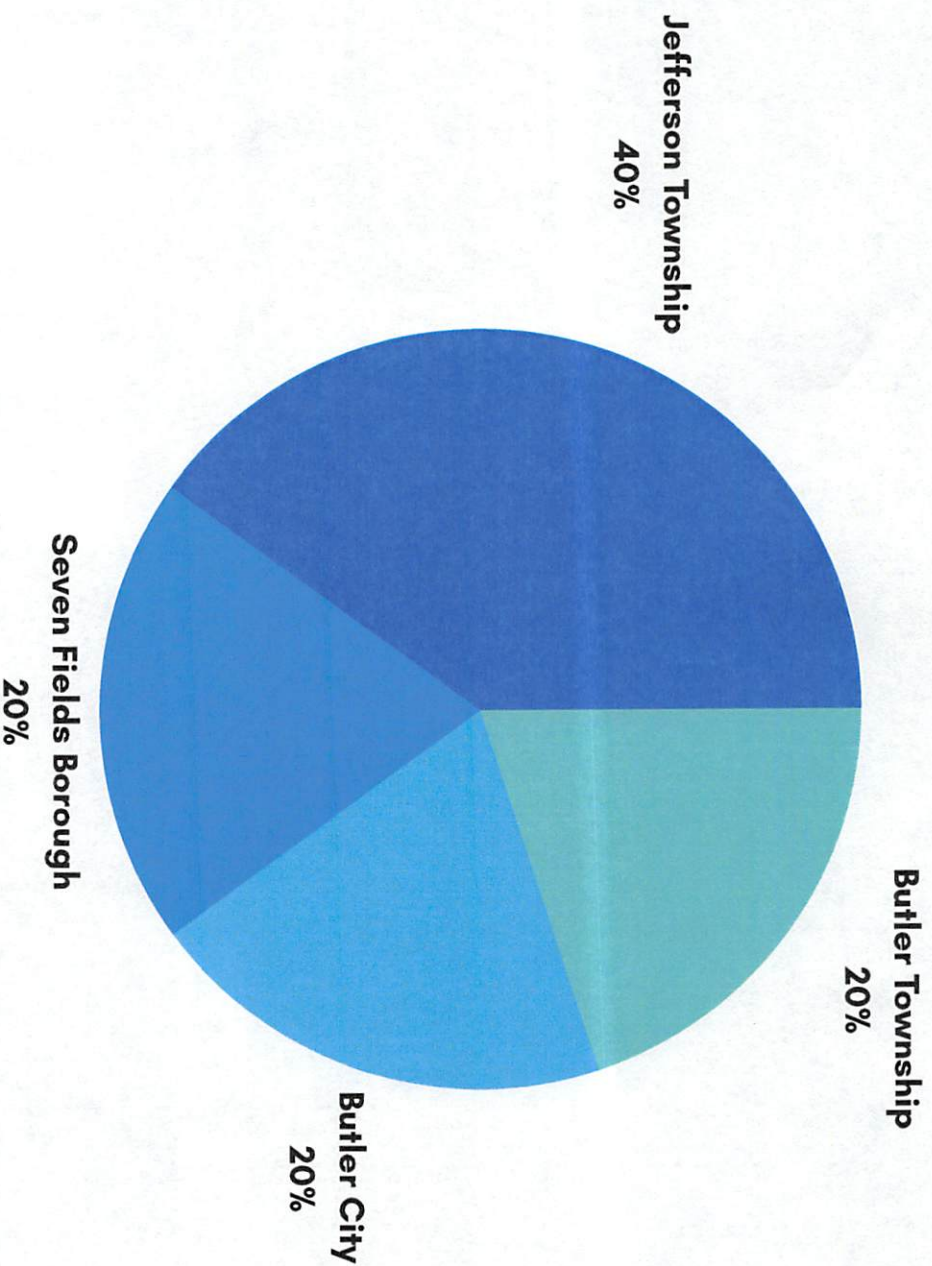
